Brandeis was established in 1948 by the American Jewish community at a time when Jews and other ethnic and racial minorities as well as women, faced discrimination in higher education. Its visionary founders created a nonsectarian research university that welcomed talented faculty and students of all backgrounds and beliefs.

### The Study Group Guide

The Study Group Guide has undergone an update! An important feature of the new format is that it can easily be updated and remain current throughout the year. To navigate from page to page of this Study Guide, see the instructions on page 1.

### Registration

**New Registration system!** While the screens look different than previous years, the new system is easy to use. As in the Study Group Guide, the groups are listed alphabetically by day of the week plus those on various days.

**Time Limit.** There is a time limit to the checkout process. You will need to be prepared with your list of groups, the associated group numbers, and your credit card, *before* you start registering.

**Waitlist.** Once a group is full, the 'register' button changes to a 'waitlist' button. Click it if you want to be added to the waitlist. Fill out your name, etc. and SUBMIT. Then continue registering for other groups.

**Pairs Groups.** We have several study groups where two people can participate as a pair for a \$40 registration fee. One of the pair must register and pay for both individuals. Both parties need to be Chapter members.

**Number of Groups.** During the first week that registration is open for all chapter members, you will be allowed to register for **up to five (5) groups.** This is so that more members will have an opportunity to join groups. You may register for additional groups during the second week of registration or any time after that. You will receive an eblast reminder about this.



Before you begin, please read these Step-by-step instructions Watch for the eblast alerting you to when Registration is open and the link is active. If you do not get the eblast on September 4, go to the <u>BNC Phoenix website</u> and click on the Registration link.

### **BEFORE** You Register:

- 1. Read the descriptions in this Study Group Guide starting on <u>page 11</u>. Groups are listed in alphabetical order by day of the week and then those on various days.
- 2. Write down the Study Group names and associated numbers of your choices. Only the name and number will be listed in the online registration system.
- 3. Have your credit card ready to use for checkout.
- 4. Click on the **Registration** link in your email **or** the link on the <u>BNC Phoenix website</u>.






#### Scroll down until you see the **Register** buttons.

Each Study Group is listed with the number and name corresponding to the Study Group Guide and has a **Register** button beneath it.

The registration fee for most Study Groups is \$20. Pairs Groups are \$40 (for two participants). For several groups, a facilities fee is included in the registration fee.


If the group has reached its maximum number, you will see a **Join Waitlist** button instead of the **Register** button. Click the button and follow the prompts. A pop-up box will appear, letting you know that you have been waitlisted.

# After you have selected your Study Groups, SCROLL to this section.

A Promo Code is provided to facilitators only if they facilitate multiple groups. If you facilitate multiple groups, enter the code you received via email and click on **Apply Promo Code.** If you are NOT facilitating multiple groups, skip this field.

Fill in your name and contact information, then click **Continue**. The next screen will take you to a list of your groups and then to the Shopping Cart.

Enter your credit card information then click on **Submit Payment**. Note: You will have a total of 15 minutes to complete this process.

If you registered successfully, you will receive a system-generated email from BNC with your registration information. **SAVE THIS EMAIL** electronically. You will need it to modify and add additional Study Groups.

If you are Waitlisted and a space opens, you will be notified by email. You have 24 hours to respond to the email and register. If you do not respond the space will go to the next name on the waitlist.

Group facilitators will send you a Welcome email once they receive a list of registrants. This may not come for several weeks. Please be patient.






